A Sacred Place

Although the Chapel is located in a house, it retains its character as a Sacred place; for in it the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered each day. As such, those who assist at Mass, ought to dress appropriately. As per Catholic custom, women ought to wear a head-covering, either a veil or hat. Holy Communion is received kneeling and on the tongue. All Catholics in the State of Grace are welcome to receive Holy Communion.

The Sacristy, Confessional & Rest Room

The room adjacent to the Chapel serves as the Sacristy & Confessional. Confessions are done in a manner to ensure the confidentiality necessary for the sacrament. A sign posted on the door will indicate that Confessions are being heard. The restroom is located at the rear.

Directions/Driving Considerations

Since on weekdays there is school traffic, we recommend the following when coming to the chapel:

From Highway 19 South:

Turn left at the traffic light at the Square, then continue through the following traffic light, and turn right off of Hwy 18 (Barnesville St) onto Banks St, which is the first road on the right.

Highway 18 East:

Upon arriving at the traffic light at the Square, continue straight through the following traffic light and turn right off of Hwy 18 (Barnesville St) onto Banks St. It is the first road on the right.

Important Note: Banks St is narrow but it is considered two lanes. The Chapel is in the two-story white house on the left (east) – 114 Banks St. Parking is available at the back of the house or on the flat lot adjacent to the house. The door to the Chapel is accessed from the porch at the back of the house.

The Traditional Latin Mass

The Traditional Latin Mass is offered exclusively at the chapel. Red booklet missals are provided for use during Mass to enable the faithful, especially those experiencing the Traditional Latin Mass for the first time or who are still relatively new to it, to more fully participate in the Mass.

After assisting at Mass for some time, you may wish to purchase a Daily Missal. The *St Andrews Daily Missal* or the *Father Lasance Daily Missal* each contain all of the prayers of the Mass in both Latin and English. A third recommended option is *Benedictus*, a monthly subscription magazine that provides similar aids to Mass and family prayers as the *St. Andrews* and *Fr. Lasance Missals*. Patronage & Altar

The Chapel has adopted Our Lady as its patronage under the title, Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Under this title, the Blessed Virgin Mary entrusted the Brown Scapular and the promises which adhere to the Catholic Church through the Order of Preachers.

The altar of the chapel is made holy by a first class relic of Saint Sabina of Rome, who was denounced, then accused of being a Christian by the Prefect, Elpidio. She suffered martyrdom at Rome around 126 AD. Sancta Sabina is the earliest extant basilica in Rome; It is the mother church of the Roman Catholic Order of Preachers, better known as the Dominicans.
